## Advanced Issues in Professional Nursing – Nurse Educators

**Course description:** This course is designed to focus attention on the influence of political, legal, socioeconomic, and technological aspects in the delivery of nursing care. Students will explore and analyze current issues in the nursing arena.

**Objectives:** At the completion of this course the student will:

- 1. Analyze the influence of economics, ethics and technology on nursing education and practice.
- 2. Analyze selected issues impacting implementation of the role of nurse educator such as:
  - Tenure, promotion and faculty welfare
  - Legal and ethical issues and regulations
  - Career planning
  - Developing a research agenda
  - Student and faculty diversity issues
  - Evidence based practice
  - Student issues related to substance abuse, ethics, etc.
  - Issues in Higher Education
