General Education Course Content and Learning Outcomes: Biol-207 fulfills the D.1. (Science/Mathematics) general education requirement. In addition, this course is a requirement for some degree programs such as nursing, pre-pharmacy, pre-veterinary medicine, and others. - > READ BEFORE PURCHASING TEXTBOOK

The Biology Department at WKU has worked over the past year to develop a new model for textbook adoption. In order to save you some money, maximize your effective use of your textbook, increase learning and evaluate the best ways of teaching you difficult topics, we've entered into a partnership with McGraw-Hill publishers. By enrolling in this course, you agree to purchase the digital materials associated with this course. These materials include 12-month or 24-month (depending on the course) access to Connect, LearnSmart practice module and a downloadable e-copy of the textbook which is yours to keep, and the option to print a gray-scale copy of your textbook at greatly reduced cost. The cost per text, with all online materials, is \$75, about 35% to 50% the cost of purchasing a new textbook, even before purchasing online materials. If you want a printed copy, that's about \$25, but you must order that through the WKU Store during the first week of class. In order to make these savings available to you, WKU must institutionalize the purchasing process. As a result, about two weeks into the semester, you will

be billed the cost of the materials for the course. The nice thing about this is that you will have access to all the course materials from day one, without doing a thing! If you choose to drop the course during the regular add-drop period, you won't be charged for the book. You should note that for this course, you WILL be charged for the digital materials. **Do NOT buy a copy of the book from online or local vendors. ONLY the digital format will be used in this course.** If you are enrolling in a two-semester course sequence (Biol 131-231 or Biol 120-122), you have full access to the digital materials online for 24 months, plenty of time to take both courses and even take a semester off in between without paying twice for the materials.

We anticipate that this approach to teaching will result in better learning and a more interesting classroom experience for you, and less stress on your spine!

HOW TO READ, PRACTICE AND LEARN (must read to score good points)

- [A] **PowerPoint Presentations**: Course materials will be posted as PowerPoint presentations that are meticulously prepared. The presentation provides clearly defined learning goals, simple definitions/concepts, suitable examples, and beautiful illustrations. It will be easier for you to understand Chapter content with slide reading. Book Chapters are voluminous, therefore, PPT slides will also guide you what to focus. I recommend consulting E. book for detailed explanations. Materials covered on these slides will be mainly included in tests.
- [B] **LearnSmart Practice**: LearnSmart is the most widely used interactive learning resource that is designed to maximize productivity and efficiency in learning. This suite spans the entire learning process from course prep to concept mastery and it creates high impact study sessions that focus students on the concepts that they need to learn. It is the part of the McGraw Hill digital package (Connect) that you buy from WKU bookstore. How to access chapters on LearnSmart? Go to Blackboard course site -> Tools -> McGraw Hill Higher Education -> Go to my Connect section -> Connect screen -> LIBRARY on top left -> LearnSmart -> Chapters

I highly recommend you to do practice of the concerned chapter materials with LearnSmart suit after you read PPT slides. As soon as you open a chapter, you will see a pop up coming with varieties of questions. Get responding the questions, it will show your right or wrong attempts. It will teach you like a classroom teacher asking questions and then giving you the correct answers at the end. I believe this system is very useful for learning. As I will not assign any of these as an assignment, so you will not lose any course points for your incorrect choices or abortive attempts. You can practice until you develop mastery over the materials.

[C] **Practicing quizzes**: Connect digital package has a reservoir of chapter questions made in form of quizzes. How to access these quizzes? Go to Blackboard course site -> Tools -> McGraw Hill Higher Education -> Go to my Connect section -> Connect screen -> LIBRARY on top left -> STUDENT RESOURCES - Choose a chapter from the drop down box -> Pay attention to the Pre and Post Test Quizzes. Post Test quizzes are particularly helpful. Many of these questions show up in the exams.

I highly recommend practicing chapter quizzes. You will not lose anything by your incorrect answers, as these are not included as part of the exam policy in this course.

EXAM POLICY

Exams are designed to test an understanding of the methods of scientific inquiry. You must check the Blackboard announcement regularly for all tests or exams.

- 1. Midterms: Midterms are close-book, timed-tests. There will be **two** Midterms, each carrying 100 points and *including materials covered before*. The questions will be multiple choices, True/False type. Midterms will be available on Blackboard *for a period of 24 hours*, and can be taken from your personal computer during the designated period of time. You will be responsible for the appropriate browser compatible to Blackboard and internet connection (check the requirement: http://www.wku.edu/it/blackboard/). Your grade will not be entered after the due date.
- 2. Final: Final is a comprehensive exam conducted by WKU/DELO testing centers on the scheduled date. It includes all the materials covered in the class (approximately, an assortment of 60% questions from previous chapters and 40% from chapters afterwards). It will carry a weight of 100 points. Questions will be multiple choices, True/False similar to midterms. Like midterms, it will also be posted on Blackboard (Tests/Quizzes) and can be taken from personal computer.
- 3. You will need to register, in advance, with the DELO Testing Office for your final exam. You will receive a notification from WKU/DELO office in this regard. Alternatively, you may visit http://www.wku.edu/reachu/testing%20center/topnet.htm to register via TopNet, when you want to take final exam from the campus testing center.
