- B. Demonstrate application of the research process through research utilization/EBP.
- C. Investigate sources appropriate for funding nursing research.
- D. Disseminate research findings for the improvement of nursing practice.

- D. Select and discuss an appropriate model or theory as a framework for your paper.

## III. CRITICAL APPRAISAL OF THE LITERATURE [35 points]

- A. Identify the methods/search strategy for the literature review
- B. Discuss the nature of evidence related to this topic
- C. Analyze, synthesize, evaluate and summarize the literature. Identify similarities, differences, gaps and problems in the literature.

## IV. CLINICAL PRACTICE IMPLICATIONS [10 points]

A. Describe clinical practice implications, based on the evidence in the literature.

## V. LITERATURE REVIEW SUMMARY TABLE / PINCH GRID [10 points]
