I. Exams

There are three (4) exams @ 100 points each. Each exam covers approximately 3 chapters. The exams are composed of 50 *multiple choice questions*. Students are responsible for all material associated with an exam and the course. The outline or class schedule will tell you what chapters you are require to know for each exam. You have 1 hour to complete each exam. This means that there are no two exams exactly the same. Since each exam is TIMED, it is IMPERATIVE that you study and prepare before you start taking the exam. Students who try to read the material just before the exam day and/or during the exam do not perform well. As a general rule of thumb, you should spend NO MORE than 45 seconds on each multiple choice question.

It is essential that you be at a reliable computer [WKU Computer labs, etc.] when taking the exams. You have one opportunity to take the exams so it is advised that you eliminate all possible sources of distraction. Also, everything else on your computer needs to be closed and all other browsers needs to be closed with the exam being the only thing opened! Blackboard recognizes when you leave and go into another browser and may kick you out and block you from finishing the exam!

NO MAKEUP EXAMS WILL BE GIVEN. (You must take the other exams during the regularly scheduled times in order to receive course credit).

Exams will be opened the first day of class and will be available UNTIL 10:00 P.M. on the due date. You can take the exam any time during this time frame but remember once you start the exam, you MUST finish it within the 1 hour time frame. For each minute you exceed the 1 hour time limit, you will lose 2 points from your exam grade.

➤ Before you take the exam, you must have completed all assignments and quizzes that is due that week. Failure to do so will result in a "0" on any uncompleted quizzes or assignments.

2. Quizzes

There are eleven (11) quizzes @ 20 points each. The lowest quiz will be dropped so the final grade will be based on 10 out the 11 guizzes. The guizzes are not timed so take your time and do well. Each guiz consist of 20 multiple choice questions covering a chapter in the textbook. You will be allowed to consult your books and notes. In other words, the quizzes are open-book! Quizzes will be posted to Blackboard for you to take on your own computer. You will have until 10:00pm (Central Time) that same day to complete the guiz. Also, make sure you save you guizzes and exams after every 4-5 questions because if you are idle for any length of time, blackboard may require you to login again thus losing any work you have completed. When finished with quizzes and exams, you must click the summit button. DO NOT CLICK THE SUMMIT BUTTON UNTIL YOU ARE COMPLETELY FINISHED. Since guizzes aren't timed. you can save your answers and finish at a later time as long as you click save and not submit. Once submitted, students cannot get back into the quiz.

3. Assignments

There are eleven (11) assignments @ 20 points each. The lowest assignment will be dropped so the final grade will be based on 10 out the 11 assignments. There will be two questions per chapter. Instructions and assignments are located on Blackboard, Answer each question thoroughly.
