Course description:

This capstone field course is an advanced, applied learning experience for anyone studying meteorology. The focus of the course is use various theories and conceptual frameworks of atmospheric understanding and make daily near-term, nowcast predictions for severe convective storms across the central United States. Students are required to make numerous forecasts throughout each day, lead and/or contribute to each forecast discussion, and document the forecast outcomes as they unfold in real time at the location of the predicted target.
