There will be five mid-term exams and quiz. Each mid-term test is worth 20% of your grade (the lowest test score will be dropped), quiz are 20% (An average of your quiz score, after dropping the 3 lowest scores).

Description: The traditional third semester in the calculus sequence. Topics include vector-valued functions, functions of several variables (partial derivatives, gradients, tangent planes, normal lines, Lagrange multipliers) multiple integrals (iterated-, double-, triple-integrals), and vector fields (line integrals, conservative vector fields, Green's theorem).

Learning Objectives: MATH 237 has the following learning objectives:

Learning Objective 1: Translate information given in words as symbolic (mathematical) form.

Learning Objective 2: Interpret information given in mathematical form (in words).

Learning Objective 3: Use the techniques to solve applications, such as areas, volumes, arc lengths, etc.

Learning Objective 4: Learn to use line and surface integrals.

Learning Objective 5: Learn to apply Green's theorem.
