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Course Description:

Welcome to KIN 503: Advanced Motor Learning and Control. This class has been designed to provide students a better understanding of the theories and principles of learning as they apply to the acquisition of gross motor skills. Emphasizes the interpretation and practical application of experimental data.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course students will have achieved the following objectives: 1.) Understand the mechanisms of motor control at both the psychological and neurological level of analysis.

2.) Identify the concepts that underline the acquisition and retention of movement skills.

3.) Perceive the process of multiple feedback and learning.

Course Format:

Due to the web-paced nature of this course you will need to be both motivated and responsible as you will cover 12 subject areas throughout the semester. The course will consist of four unit assignments consisting of chapter questions and one written term paper (see term paper assignment). All materials will be available upon the opening of the course site and you will be free to work at your own rate, but must adhere to the five established course deadlines.

Assignments:

Unit Assignments-

1.) Unit 1 "Introduction to Motor Skills and Abilities" Read Unit 1 Introduction to Motor Skills and Abilities (Chapters 1, 2, and 3). Answer the chapter questions as they relate to Unit 1. Due Sunday, Feb. 28th by 11:55pm.

2.) Unit 2 "Introduction to Motor Control"

Read Unit 2 Introduction to Motor Control (Chapters 4, 5, and 6). Answer the chapter questions as they relate to Unit 2. Due Sunday, March 20th by 11:55pm.

3.) Unit 4 "Introduction to Motor Skill Learning" Read Unit 4 Introduction to Motor Skill Learning (Chapters 11, 12, and 13). Answer the chapter questions as they relate to Unit 4. Due Sunday, April 10th by 11:55pm.

4.) Unit 6 "Practice Conditions" Read Unit 6 Practice Conditions (Chapters 16, 17, and 18). Answer the chapter questions as they relate to Unit 6. Due Sunday, May 1st by 11:55pm.

Term Paper Assignment-

Students will independently investigate a topic relevant to the discipline of motor learning. You are free to choose your topic, however, I am providing the following topics to help formulate ideas:

- Amount and distribution of practice sessions
- Mental practice or mental imagery
- Instruction and feedback

You will find relevant literature on the topic (from scholarly journals, magazines, books, and newspapers- *at least three sources must come from scholarly peer reviewed journals).* By **Sunday, April the 10**th (due date of Unit 4 material) you need to email me with the topic and title of your paper. The term paper with cover page and reference page is due by **Tuesday, May 10**th **by 11:55pm**. The body of the paper must be at least six full pages double-spaced (not including cover page and references). For more information on style, see the "Policies" section of the syllabus along with the "APA Information" menu tab within the course site.

Policies:

- Term paper formatting- "APA 6th edition" formatting title page, body, referencing and bibliography.
- The paper should be typed using 12 point, Times New Roman font and double-spaced. Margins should be set at 1 inch on all four sides.
- The paper should be completed as a Word or Plain Text Document. Your file must remain in .doc, .docx, or .txt formats. Save the file to a local drive then upload the file to the course website using the "Browse My Computer" option.
- Grammar, punctuation, and spelling will be included in the evaluation of the paper (up to 10% of total possible points). Must adhere to APA guidelines (6th ed.).
- Any assignment due date, not indicated in the syllabus, will be determined during the course of the semester and put on the ANNOUNCEMENTS page of Blackboard.
- All assignments MUST be completed in order to receive a grade in the course.
- Each student is responsible for completing the assignments on time. All assignments are to be uploaded to the appropriate assignment folder before the designated due date/time to receive full credit. You will be allowed to complete incomplete assignments at the end of the term for 70% credit.
- Students my not submit a paper that has been utilized in another class. They may write about the same topic and use resources from another class, but the paper should be unique to the course.
