Course Description: Continued study of the analysis of the scientific principles of human nutrition in relation to health and disease. Emphasis is placed on intervention strategies for specific disease conditions and disorders. Includes laws, regulations and standards related to dietetic practice.

Course Goal: This course is intended to provide the knowledge and skills required of nutrition professionals to work in the area of medical nutrition therapy.

Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Utilize knowledge of human physiology and pathology, biochemistry, and normal nutrition to determine nutritional implications and interventions for various disease states.
- 2. Become familiar with the medical model as the setting for clinical nutrition.
- 3. Apply knowledge of food composition to formulation of therapeutic diets and menus.
- 4. Utilize principles of nutrition assessment, planning, intervention, and evaluation to develop nutrition care plans based on dietary intake, laboratory data, and anthropometric values.
- 5. Be familiar with delivery of food and nutrition services in health care systems.
- 6. Apply current research information and methods to dietetic practice.
- 7. Be more familiar with appropriate medical terminology and abbreviations used in the health care setting.
