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Course Description:

Welcome to PE 310: Kinesiology. This course has been designed to assist you in gaining an understanding of the study of human movement through a combination of the fields of anatomy, physiology, and mechanical engineering. Students will examine musculoskeletal origins, insertions, and actions as they function to create movement.

- 5.) Learn a systematic approach to the analysis of human motion.
