Purpose

The purpose of this course is to provide an introductory knowledge of finance necessary to manage a health care entity. This course will encompass basic financial and managerial accounting while also focusing on financial theories and methods key to the operation of health care organizations. It is designed to provide you with an in-depth understanding of how managerial accounting information is generated and used by individuals internal to the organization. We will discuss various aspects of cost and revenue behavior. The primary emphasis is on cost behavior and issues associated with the interpretation of accounting, financial, and operational information.

Course Objectives

- 1. Students will demonstrate a familiarity with basic financial statements such as: balance sheet, income statement, and the statement of cash flows.
- 2. Students will demonstrate an understanding of the process of cost allocation.
- 3. Students will demonstrate a general knowledge of the sources of revenue for hospitals.
- **4.** Students will demonstrate an understanding of the budgeting process in healthcare organizations.

Participation

The assigned course material provides the basis for each online session. Students are <u>expected to</u> <u>prepare assignments prior to and contribute to online discussions</u>. In order to succeed in this course, it is essential that you <u>stay current with all reading assignments</u>, <u>do the homework</u>, <u>and ask questions</u> about material that is confusing or unclear. Experience has proven that those who

keep up and put effort into the course have little difficulty passing the course. On the other hand, those who put forth little effort and get behind are soon lost.

A good plan of attack for learning the material is to first scan the chapter, read the questions at the end of the chapter, then read the chapter.

Health Finance Discussion Board: For the health finance discussion board forum, students will be required to respond to health policy articles, case studies, or other course material posted throughout the semester. More details regarding the discussion boards will be provided later.

Quizzes and Homework Submissions: Quizzes and homework submissions may be announced and unannounced depending upon circumstances. Expect at least one quiz and/or homework submission per chapter.

Examinations: There will be two in class examinations which will cover the chapters and lectures being covered in class, assigned readings and information from the assignments.
