Course Description:

A review of public health practice organizational structure and the data-driven delivery of health promotion activities to improve population health.

Course Goals:

To introduce students to issues in the public health field with particular emphasis on topics related to the administration of public health programs/policies and delivery of health promotion activities.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, students should demonstrate mastery of the following objectives:

- 1. Describe critical issues confronting public health practice in Kentucky and the United States.
- 2. Demonstrate how management by objectives impacts the structure and delivery of public health services and policies.
- 3. Recognize and describe various health department structures utilized in the United States.
- 4. Utilize available information to plan programs and policies, including the use of introductory budgeting skills for these purposes.
- 5. Improved leadership and accountability skills through group classroom discussion, group projects and a commitment to excellence.

- 2. <u>Individual Projects</u>- There will be two (2) of these. One will be a profile of a local health department somewhere in the US. The other is a project on the ACA Preventive Health Services. Details of the projects will be posted on blackboard, emailed to you or handed out in class.
- 3. Group Projects There will be two (2) group projects. One will be to formulate a data-driven public health policy relevant to the health status challenges of a given state in the US. The other will be to organize a public health program, based on improving some aspect of health status of a target population in a given state in the US. Details of the projects will be posted on blackboard, emailed to you or handed out in class.
- 4. <u>Discussion Board Assignments</u>- These assignments will be our weekly online class work. There will be recommended readings based on the weekly topics. There may be PowerPoints to review. On Fridays (by 8am) of each week before an online class, I will post questions on the recommended materials to review. To receive your full 25 points, you are responsible for replying to the questions, statements, or activities and also commenting on at least two class member's replies. Your discussions need to be well thought out displaying utilization of critical thinking skills and contain information reflective of the recommended readings. Please spread the commenting around and don't reply with simple responses such as "I agree!"- these will not reflect well in your points for the week. Also, comments that are rude, offensive, and inappropriate will not be tolerated; we will be respectful of the views of others.
- 5. <u>2 Exams</u>- The exams, a midterm and a final, in this course will be based on material from recommended text, material present by the instructor, online discussions, as well as individual and group projects and other activities. Please read all recommended readings. All exams will be taken on blackboard or emailed to you. They will be multiple choice, short answer, and essay format.

Make-up exams will be given \underline{only} with documented medical excuses or emergencies discussed prior to the exam.
