Course Description:

This on-line course teaches students the processes for planning, developing, writing and managing successful grant proposals and funding requests. Students will utilize a textbook, supplemented by additional materials provided by the instructor, to simulate an actual grant/funding proposal.

Course Objectives:

This course is designed to:

- Teach students how to successfully plan, develop, and write successful grant proposals and funding requests for the needs of non-profit and governmental organizations.
- Provide students with an understanding of the grant review process from a funders/grant reviewer's perspective that will enable students to be proficient grant/funding proposal writers

Required Text:

Successful completion of this course requires that students obtain their own personal copy (available through Amazon.com, ecampus.com, or WKU Bookstore) of the following text:

Attendance:

As this is a web-based course attendance is not tracked.

Grading:

Students will have the opportunity to earn a maximum of 750 total points during the semester with grades based on the Western KY University grading system in place at the start of the course.

Grading for this course will be based on the following measurement tools:

- **Exams**
 - 5 exams given through course of semester worth a possible 30 points each
 - 150 possible points for exams
- **Assignments**
 - 11 assignments worth a possible 50 points each
 - 550 possible points for assignments
- **Final Project**
 - Grant Reviewer Exercise worth a possible 50 points
 - Students will review and score a grant proposal

Make-up/Late Work:

In the field of grant writing and securing outside funding, through submitted proposals, it is very rare that extensions are granted for missed deadlines. Since this course is designed to prepare you to be successful in obtaining funding through grants and proposals, I will only accept late or missed work for extraordinary circumstances.

Any request for submitting late or missed assignments must be submitted in writing, via email (daron.jordan@wku.edu) **no later than 12 hours prior to the stated deadline for the assignment.** All requests will be decided on a case-by-case basis. Any work that I agree to accept as late will automatically receive a minimum of one letter grade reduction. Exams and the Final Project will not be accepted late.
