Grade

Exams

There are three **(4) exams @ 100 points** each. Each exam covers approximately 3 chapters. The exams are composed of 50 *multiple choice questions*. Students are responsible for all material associated with an exam and the course. The outline or class schedule will tell you what chapters you are required to know for each exam. You have 45 minutes to complete each exam. Since each exam is **TIMED**, it is **IMPERATIVE** that you study and prepare before you start taking the exam. Students who try to read the material just before the exam day and/or during the exam do not perform well. As a general rule of thumb, you should spend **NO MORE** than 45 seconds on each multiple choice question.

It is essential that you be at a reliable computer when taking the exams. You have one opportunity to take the exams so it is advised that you eliminate all possible sources of distraction. Also, everything else on your computer needs to be closed and all other browsers needs to be closed with the exam being the only thing opened! Blackboard recognizes when you leave and go into another browser and may kick you out and block you from finishing the exam!

NO MAKEUP EXAMS WILL BE GIVEN.

- **Exams will be opened the first day of class and will be available UNTIL 10:00 P.M. on the due date. You can take the exam any time during this time frame but remember once you start the exam, you MUST finish it within the 45 minute time frame. For each minute you exceed the 45 minutes time limit, you will lose 2 points from your exam grade.**
- **Before you take the exam, you must have completed all assignments and quizzes that is due that week. Failure to do so will result in a "0" on any uncompleted quizzes or assignments.**

2. Quizzes

There are Twelve **(12) quizzes @ 20 points** each. The quizzes are not timed so take your time and do well. Each quiz consists of 20 multiple choice questions covering a chapter in the textbook. You will be allowed to consult your books and notes. In other words, the quizzes are open-book! Quizzes will be posted to Blackboard for you to take on your own computer. **You will have until 10:00pm (Central Time) that same day to complete the quiz.** Also, make sure you save your quizzes and exams after every 4-5 questions because if you are idle for

any length of time, blackboard may require you to login again thus losing any work you have completed. When finished with quizzes and exams, you must click the submit button. **DO NOT CLICK THE SUMMIT BUTTON UNTIL YOU ARE COMPLETELY FINISHED.** Since quizzes aren't timed, you can save your answers and finish at a later time as long as you click save and not submit. Once submitted, students cannot get back into the quiz.

3. Assignments

There are twelve **(12) assignments @ 20 points** each. There will be two questions per chapter. These assignments are very important for you to learn and grasp the material. Therefore you will need to put forth some effort when answering them. Anyone can look in the back of the book or margins of the chapter and copy down the definition. That's not what I'm looking for and the grade will suffer if this is all you attempt. I don't want it to be in a list either. **First**, type the question. **Second**, put it in paragraph form so that it flows nicely and is easy to read and understand. **Third**, be very thorough in your answer and if there is a person associated with that information, tell who it is and something about him/her. **Forth**, information needs to come from the textbook. Any other sources will result in a failing grade. Your goal when answering these questions should be to write and explain the information in a way that anyone could read it and understand what you're talking about.
