Emergency Management Policy and Practices Fall 2019 Syllabus

- II. Course Description: Provides an in-depth look at disaster response and emergency management practices both within the U.S. and globally. The student will develop a thorough working knowledge of The Incident Command System, including application for small to large incidents, integration of command across local, state, federal and international response agencies.
- III. - IV. Class Attendance and Participation: This is a web-based online course. Students are free to manage their schedules within and around the due dates of the various assignments. Participation in class discussion board assignments is required and students must participate on a regular basis throughout the course. Class participation is a student responsibility and will be considered in determining the final grade.
- V. Grading Procedure: The instructor may modify the syllabus to accommodate appropriate coverage of topics. This course will utilize Blackboard to enhance learning opportunities. You should regularly access the course site to view announcements, course instructions, submit assignments, review lecture notes, etc.

Examinations: Two examinations will be given according to the class outline. Test questions will be taken from discussion assignments, reading assignments, handouts, audiovisuals, and material discussed since the preceding test. Each test will count 100 points with a possible total of 200 points. All exams will be completed using the testing capabilities of the Blackboard learning management system. Students must take the exam at the scheduled date/time. Exams will be timed and scored immediately upon completion. The final exam must be taken on the date stipulated in the WKU Final Exam calendar or as directed by the instructor.

<u>Discussions:</u> The minimum participation is 3 times on 3 separate days a week for each forum. Each discussion assignment will be posted in the Discussion section of Blackboard. Total points for all 4 discussions is 100 points. Grading will be based on the following requirements:

A (90-100 points) = Three or more substantial postings in each graded forum. The postings provide insightful comments and stimulate active discussion threads. Posts provide good responses to questions posed, read the comments of others and interact with them.

B (80-89 points) = Meets the minimum participation requirements. Postings initiate few interesting threads and are not interacting with others.

C (70-79 points) = Two substantial posts followed by one general response in each forum per week.

D (60-69 points) = Fewer than 2 postings or one day of participation and non-interacting.

 - 3) Provide an assessment of Indirect Impacts to community; including time to recovery, estimated costs associated with the event.
 - 4) Describe the incident command structure if provided or discernable from your sources.
 - 5) Detail mitigation actions implemented as a result of this incident to prevent or minimize the impact of a similar incident in the future.
