Prerequisites:

Two years of high school algebra or concurrent enrollment in a college algebra course

Course Description:

CS 146 is an introduction to problem solving using a computer programming language. This course provides students with the ability to understand and apply math and problems solving skills and concepts. NO prior programming experience is required. The course may not be counted toward a computer science major or minor.

Learning Objectives:

This course fulfills the Quantitative Reasoning requirement in the Foundations category of WKU's Colonnade program. As part of that program, CS 146 has the following learning objectives:

Students will demonstrate the ability to:

- Interpret information presented in mathematical and/or statistical forms.
- Illustrate and communicate mathematical and/or statistical information symbolically, visually and/or numerically.
- Determine when computations are needed and execute the appropriate computations.
- Apply an appropriate model to the problem to be solved.
- Make inferences, evaluate assumptions, and assess limitations in estimation modeling and/or statistical analysis.
