Exam

- There will be one midterm and one final exam.
- No makeup will be given for exams under normal circumstances. If you can't attend the

- The exam exact dates will be posted on Blackboard at the start of the semester. You will take each exam in an approved testing center. There will be a "window of opportunity" to take each exam. These "windows of opportunity" will be three days (Thursday-Saturday), so it will be very important for to you to schedule your exam as soon as you are able (I will send a detailed email about this prior to the first exam). Each student will schedule their testing times online with the appropriate testing center. All students will take these exams on one of the allotted days at the time in which they scheduled to be at the testing center. There will be no planned make-up exams, and missing an exam will result in a zero.
