Description: Corequisite support for students in Math 115c, Math 116c, or Math 123. Topics will include functions, graphs, and fundamental concepts of algebra. This course is required for students taking Ma 115c, Ma 116c, or Math 123 that would have previously been placed in Dma 096c.

All course notes, homework and quizzes are delivered online. I will be posting some additional materials on Blackboard, but the largest portion of the course is through this online site.

Content: We will cover chapters 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 in total or parts as time permits.
