COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an introduction to students in the issues of societal and personal attitudes towards drug use, misuse and abuse. It will provide the student a variety of approaches to drugs and drug use in the behavioral, pharmacological, historical, social, legal and clinical perspectives and will help them understand factors that enhance health, wellbeing, and quality of life. This course addresses the category F general education requirement.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon conclusion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Explain the difference in drug use and drug abuse.
- 2. Identify the effects that drug abuse can have on the nation.
- 3. Describe the three basic processes relating to addiction.
- 4. Identify the historical factors of the current federal drug regulation.
- 5. Explain how drugs affect the body.
- 6. List the categories of drugs and the system used in this process
- 7. Describe the stages of prevention and programs.
