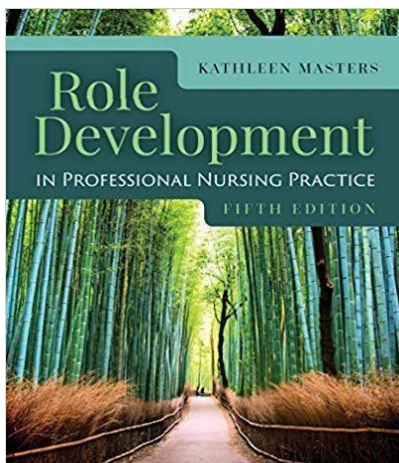
Upon completion of this course, you will be able to:

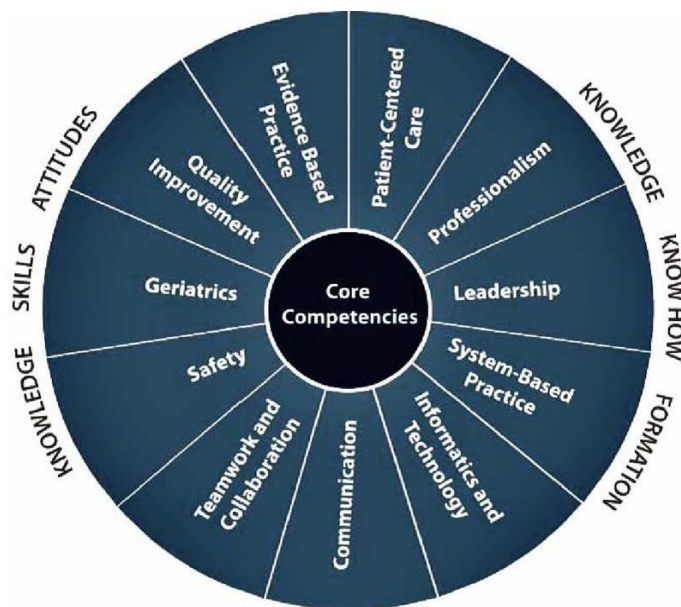

The course is divided into four specific modules. Each module is centered on four concepts of the nursing paradigm: the person, the nurse, the environment,

and the health component. Each module will interrelate the nursing core competencies from *The Nurse of the Future Nursing Core Competencies Model* as seen below. These competencies are built upon the American Association of College of Nursing (AACN) Essentials of Baccalaureate Education for Professional Nursing Practice, National League for Nursing (NLN) Council, Institute of Medicine (IOM) recommendations, Quality and Safety Education for Nurses Competencies (QSEN), and American Nursing Association (ANA) standards.

Additional information and details on these ten competencies can be found in your textbook in Chapter 4 “*Competencies for Professional Nursing Practice*”. Each competency will be discussed and reviewed in their relation to the role of the future nurse. Each module will specifically highlight these concepts and reinforce the student’s understanding of significance in nursing.
