Course Description: Co-requisite support for students in Math 115C, Math 116C, or Math 123. Topics include functions, graphs, and fundamental concepts of algebra. This course is required for students taking MA 115C, MA 116C, or MATH 123 that would have previously been placed in DMA 096C. The purpose of this class is to provide extra practice and opportunities for students to get help in building basic skills that will support the MATH 123 course. This extra help will be delivered into a Study Plan feature via MyLab Math that will be used in your MATH 123 course.

Co-Requisite: MATH 123 if

- your Math ACT score is below 22 or your Math SAT score is below 560
- AND your WKU Math Placement Exam (MPE) score is below 14

**Required Technology**: MyLab Math access. You will be required to access this platform and you will be given the access code in your MATH 123 co-requisite course. There is NOT an additional fee. MATH 105 *is embedded* within the MATH 123 course.

MyLab Math courseID is: ayers81342 BECAUSE YOU ARE REQUIRED TO BE IN MATH 105 and MATH 123. You do not need another code or a book......

Calculator: Each student is required to have a graphing calculator for use in class and for assignments. TI-84 are preferred, and instruction for these models will be given. PROHIBITED CALCULATORS include: TI-89, TI-92, Casio FX-115 series, Casio FX-991 series, and any calculator with CAS capability. Cell phone calculators are also prohibited! Smart watches are also not prohibited. If your preferred calculator is not listed in this section, verify its acceptability with your instructor!

**Attendance:** Participation in this course is crucial to your success. Of course, with COVID-19 this is an issue. This course will have a web delivery via zoom at a specific day and time. However, it is important to stay focused and diligent in your completion of all material.


## What is the MyLab Math Study Plan?

Here is how it works:

Do Study Plan Attempt the Pre-Skills Quiz Do the Homework for MATH 123

The Study Plan emphasizes skills that will support and supplement the MATH 123 homework assignments. Throughout the course, you will be presented with "Skills Pre-Quizzes" that unlock access to homework assignments. The pre-quizzes will send you to the Study Plan to achieve mastery on certain objectives if you have not already earned the mastery points.


By looking under the Prerequisites tab, you can see exactly which skills need to be mastered to grant access to the pre-quizzes.



In some cases, you can click directly on the Quiz Me button and take a five-question quiz to see if you already know how to perform the task. If the Quiz Me button is not clickable, the Study Plan wants you to Practice some problems first.

After you have achieved the necessary Mastery Points, you can go back to your main assignment list and take the associated Pre-Quiz.

Not all the Study Plan objectives are covered in the pre-quizzes. To see all the Study Plan objectives, you will be responsible for mastering, click on the Progress tab.



As you see above, there are 70+ objectives that you will be working on for Mastery. You can earn Mastery Points by going directly to the Study Plan and clicking on a section box (e.g. ARF.1, ARF.2 etc.) and doing the Practice/Quiz Me for that section.

When we begin doing regular homework in Chapter 1, you will also earn some mastery points by getting problems correct in your homework. So, getting good scores on your homework assignments will also help you out on your Study Plan!

If you would like to get a head start on the semester, you can work on the Ch. ARF, Ch. ARC, and Ch. A Study Plan objectives.

I encourage you to go ahead and try the Study Plan. You get unlimited attempts for mastery, so you cannot mess anything up by trying.
