COURSE DESCRIPTION

Mental health nursing concepts utilizing basic human needs, developmental theory, nursing process and therapeutic nursing interventions to promote and maintain health for selected populations.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The student:

- 1. Identifies current standards of nursing practice.
- 1. Utilizes nursing process to provide safe, competent, patient-centered care.
- 2. Discusses the importance of the patient's preferences, values, and needs.
- 3. Uses clinical decision making when prioritizing patient care.
- 4. Identifies teaching needs of select populations.

EXPECTATIONS-GENERAL INFORMATION

Policies and Procedures

Each student will be responsible for following the policies and required curriculum as stated in the *LPN to ASN Student Handbook*.

Classroom Attendance

This is an online course. Students are expected to follow the material and lecture schedule posted in Blackboard and review the recorded lectures.

Evaluation/Grading

The final grade for each student will be based on a percentage of total points obtained. Ninety percent (90%) of the course grade will be awarded from unit exams and a comprehensive final. Ten percent (10%) of the course grade will be awarded from the student's score on the course's HESI standardized examination. Unit examinations will consist of various test question formats including but not limited to multiple-choice questions. The final exam will be comprehensive. Testing material may be taken from text reading assignments, class lectures, handout materials, study guides, case studies, instructional audio/video recordings, and assigned readings from sources other than course text.

Tests for this course shall be taken via Proctor-U or in the WKU testing center, or an approved testing site. It is the student's responsibility to schedule each test using the directions sent to students via email by the DELO Testing Center. Students must complete all exams between the hours of 6:00 AM and 8:00 PM CST on the assigned day.

Use the following formula to calculate student course grade:

The grading scale for total points earned is as follows:

In order to successfully complete the course a 77.0% minimum will be required. A student with an average of 76.9% or below will not be successful.

In order to add activity points, the student MUST have a Course Grade of at least 77.0%.

An opportunity to improve course grade will be available by completing additional assigned activities. Each activity is worth an assigned number of credits. Students must earn at least 20 of the possible 50 points to pass the course. Students who earn less than 20 activity points will not pass the course and will receive a grade of "D", regardless of student performance on exam grades. Student performance on assigned activities can improve the exam portion of the overall course grade. Additional points will be added as follows:

20-29 points will add ONE points to total examination points

30-39 points will add TWO points to total examination points

40-50 points will add THREE points to total examination points

COURSE GRADE APPEALS

Any appeals for an alternate response to be counted as correct must be negotiated with the course faculty. Students have one week following the grade to challenge the test or assignment grade. Challenges must be made in writing and based on material the student can reference in their textbook. This process must take place within the designated time frame, not after final course grades have been posted. In addition, the student must question specific test, paper, or assignment items, and not just ask for points to be added to their grade due to their individual needs and life circumstances.

Students wishing to appeal a test or assignment or other grade in this course must follow the following process.

Additional points for test or other assignments will not be considered after the student has failed the course, unless the test falls within the one week challenge period. Any test item challenges must be conducted in the week following the exam, and must be resolved with the faculty member at that time, based on information from the course materials such as the textbook. The faculty member is considered the expert and the faculty members' option of the correct answer will be the final answer.
