## **CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

MKT 427 Entrepreneurial Marketing, 3 hours, Prerequisite - MKT 220. A study of key marketing strategies relevant to new ventures that prepares students to work in an entrepreneurial firm to run their own business.

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

The major objectives of this course are to understand basic marketing concepts/strategies in an entrepreneurial context, and to apply these concepts in an entrepreneurial marketing plan.

## **STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES**
