Class Location: Online

Course Description:

Examines behaviors and environmental conditions that enhance or hinder an individual's health status. In addition to exploring social and environmental factors, students are encouraged to think critically about behavioral choices that impact ones' health. Students assess their individual behavior in the light of current scientific knowledge concerning in various aspects of personal health. This course meets Category F General Education requirement and also meets the Colonnade requirement: Exploration-Social and Behavioral Sciences requirement and helps students understand the factors that enhance health, well-being, and quality of life”.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Describe how personal health behaviors affect their current and future health status including the community.
2. Investigate the role that heredity plays in individual and community health status.
3. Discuss how personal lifestyles contribute positively and negatively to one's personal health and that of the community.
4. Develop skills necessary to make healthful choices and informed decisions for personal and group health.
5. Develop strategies to change personal health behaviors that affect health negatively.
