- Students must obtain a grade of "C" (77%) or above to be successful in NURS 335.
- Students must obtain a minimum of 231 points out of 300 possible on exams, including the final, before any other points will be calculated into the grade.
 Students who do not earn 231/300 points on exams will not pass Nursing 335.
- Children, pets, friends, parents, significant others, etc. are not permitted to attend classes.

- Expected student behavior includes arriving on time; active listening; respectful attention paid to presenters, instructors and classmates; asking and/or answering questions as appropriate, and participation in group/class learning activities. Tardiness, sleeping, rudeness, disruptive behavior (ex: talking during class, texting, etc), inattentiveness and/or working on other assignments in class are not tolerated and students can be asked to leave the classroom.
- Faculty reserves the right to ask any student to halt behaviors that are viewed as disruptive or inappropriate and will ask the student to leave the classroom if the behavior continues. If a student is asked to leave the classroom he/she will be counted absent for the remainder of the class period.

Adaptive Quizzing:

• This material is to be used to enhance studying. Students are expected to use the Adaptive Quizzing material when preparing for class and studying for exams. Faculty will review grades for this material.

Exams: Please see the BSN Student Handbook for additional information related to testing policies.

- Exam content includes lecture/classroom discussion, readings, and other material as designated by the faculty.
- Exams 1, 2, 3 and 4 will each be 60 minutes in length. The final exam will be 120 minutes in length.
- Exams may be administered in a paper/pencil format or taken on an iPad/laptop. Faculty may change the test delivery method at their discretion.
 - Exams will be taken using Examplify. Please see the BSN Orientation site on BlackBoard regarding Examplify and iPad requirements.
 - Any student testing on an iPad/laptop outside of the classroom (SARC) will also test on their personal iPad/laptop through Examplify.
 - There must not be any course material on the inside of the laptop used to test. For example, no notes or stickers with any course content are allowed.
- Students must wear the SON student ID badge to enter the exam.
- Students should bring their own dry erase white board to use during the exam. Entering the exam or leaving the exam with material written on the white board may result in a grade of "0" on the exam.
- Students may be assigned seats for each examination. If a student attempts to alter or change the assigned seat s/he may receive a score of "0" on the examination and be asked to leave the room until the examination is complete.

- All materials brought to class (cell phones, backpacks, books, drinks, food, hats, coats, etc.) will be left at the front/back of the classroom. Students are not allowed to wear any watch that can send and receive text messages or connect to the internet during an exam.
- Exam scores will be available on Blackboard within one week after the examination is complete.
- If a student is unable to attend a scheduled examination, the student must notify the faculty **prior** to the examination unless there are extenuating circumstances. (See the BSN Student Handbook for what constitutes an extenuating circumstance.). The **student** is expected to contact the faculty as soon as possible to schedule a make-up examination.
- A student who does not notify the faculty of an absence **prior** to an examination and/or who cannot provide a satisfactory justification for the absence will have their achieved points on a make-up examination reduced by 10%.
- Make-up examinations must be completed within one week of the original test date unless there are extenuating circumstances. Examinations that are not made up within one week of the original test date will have the achieved points reduced by 10% each class period past the original test date unless there are extenuating circumstances.
- A make-up examination will be of a different format than the original examination.
- If an exam must be given in paper format instead of on the computer please note the following:
 - Students are to bring two sharpened #2 lead pencils with erasers to examinations.
 - The scantron serves as official documentation of selected answers. It is the scantron which will be used to determine the score regardless of what is marked on the exam.
- The faculty will hold a group review session after every student has completed an exam (exams 1-3). These reviews will be held at the end of the next class period provided everyone has taken the exam.
- Students may not request points be added to their grade.
- Faculty members are the content experts for the exam.
- Any student who is concerned about their performance or who wishes to meet with the faculty are encouraged to schedule an appointment. If a student wishes to discuss performance on an exam, an appointment should be requested/scheduled with the faculty within one week of the exam review or original test date if no review takes place. After this time, no review/discussion of the exam will occur.

- Once the course final grade is calculated and posted on TopNet, no additional exam review will take place.
- Only those students who are unsuccessful in the course will be allowed to review the final exam.

Sherpath – Preclass Assignments (PCA):

- Because these are pre-class assignments, the lessons and quizzes are due by 8:00am on the day the content is covered in class unless there is an exam. If there is an exam, the PCA will be due by 11:55pm on Saturday of the same week (see the course calendar).
- Sherpath PCA includes lessons and quizzes.
 - <u>To earn points, assignments must be completed by the due date/time.</u> Scores are awarded based on the percentage earned out of 2 points (per lesson and quiz). *For example*: If a student scores 80%, the score is recorded as 1.6 points.
 - *Caution*: Sherpath records and retains the last attempt only. Work submitted after the due date/time will result in a "LATE" message to faculty. <u>No points are awarded for late assignments and the above policy will apply</u>.
 - Sherpath Lessons can be reset by students to improve the score. Instructions are in BB.
 - Sherpath quizzes only allow one attempt. Students are encouraged to use their textbook to answer questions.

Student Responsibilities:

- Students are expected to follow all policies as printed in the Western Kentucky University School of Nursing/BSN Student Handbooks.
- All students should review Policies for Student Behavior in the Western Kentucky University School of Nursing/BSN Student Handbooks. All students are expected to follow these policies for student behavior.
- Should they be reinstated any student who does not adhere to the University/course COVID guidelines will not be allowed to remain in class. The student will be asked to leave and will be counted absent for any class time missed.
- Students are expected to be self-directed and responsible in their own learning. It is the student's responsibility to seek assistance, make up deficiencies, and attend scheduled classes. In the event of an absence, the student remains responsible for information presented and assignments made during the class.
- Students are expected to bring the textbook to class each day, read the assigned material, and review key points for each chapter. Students are expected to come to class prepared for the content being discussed.

- Students are expected to be present, punctual, and attentive for the classroom period. Faculty members may choose to assign extra work for students who have missed any part of a class or clinical to help the student regain what was lost during their absence.
- Nursing is a pre-professional program of study and students are expected to be punctual and attentive in the classroom. When absences constitute greater than 20% of total semester class hours per course, the faculty will issue a professional conduct violation. The faculty may consider extenuating circumstances after a student provides documentation of the event(s) that led to the absences. *Twenty percent of the course is equal to 7.8 hours*.
- Excused Absence: Students must notify their course faculty using the preferred method of contact as stated in the course syllabus PRIOR to the beginning of clinical, simulation, or lab for an absence to be considered excused. A student illness or injury is an example of an event that may be considered an excused absence. Faculty may request documentation for more than one absence.
- Unexcused Absence: When a student fails to notify the course faculty of the absence prior to the beginning of clinical, simulation, or lab, the absence will be regarded as a "no call, no show" situation and result in an unexcused absence. A student with one unexcused absence in a clinical, simulation, or lab will receive a clinical warning and earn zero points for any make-up assignments. This student must also attend a follow-up meeting with the course coordinator.
- <u>Extenuating circumstances</u> are unforeseen accidents, deaths in the immediate family or personal illness which requires you to be absent from class or clinical. Vacations, weddings, routine medical and/or dental appointments, studying for an exam, child care issues, job interviews, and working at your job are not considered extenuating circumstances as these are not unforeseen events. The presence of extenuating circumstances does not guarantee that the student will be exempted from the attendance policy.
- The presence of extenuating circumstances does not guarantee that a student will be exempted from this attendance policy.

Academic Honesty and Cheating:

- Any behavior of academic dishonesty will be addressed in a conference with the student and a panel of faculty.
- Any student found to be participating in academic dishonesty will receive a score of zero on the examination/quiz/ assignment/case study. Academic dishonesty may also result in the student being dismissed from the course and the program.

Blackboard/Email:

- Handouts and lecture guides will be posted for students on Blackboard. Each student is responsible for checking blackboard on a regular basis.
- Lecture guides will be posted on Blackboard prior to each class meeting.

• Students are responsible for checking their WKU email account and Blackboard on a regular basis.

Cellular Phones and other technology devices:

- Cellular phones are to be turned off or on silent <u>and put away</u> while in the classroom. Phones may be used during the break. If a student has an extenuating circumstance which requires a cell phone be left out during class the student must notify the Faculty prior to class.
