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INTRODUCTION

Course Description: Legal Environment of Business examines the framework of the American legal system from a business perspective with a substantive and analytical focus on legal, regulatory, and ethical issues that impact primary and secondary stakeholders, executives, managers, and employees of privately held and publicly held business entities.

Student Learning Outcomes: Students who have mastered the concepts and applications in this course will be able to:

1. Exhibit a working knowledge of the American legal system and how it impacts business, as well as developing a fundamental understanding of certain legal doctrines and theories of liability; and
2. Demonstrate analytical skills by identifying legal issues and concepts which arise in the context of business decision- making; and
3. Apply substantive legal theory and ethical decision-making considerations that enhance a manager's practical ability to recognize and respond to legal challenges in a business context; and
4. Articulate ways in which legal acumen adds value to a business through risk-management, business planning and problem solving.

Required Textbook: *The Legal Environment of Business*, Melvin, McGraw-Hill Publishing, 2024 Edition - packaged with Connect.

This course will serve as a “primer” on how the American legal system works. Some things will be interesting (constitutional law and torts) and other things will be pretty “non-exciting”. You must know a lot of these things if you are going to enter the business field. When you finally encounter them in practice, you will be glad you were taught about them.

Student's grades will be determined by two exams, the LearnSmart modules and a Courtroom visit. Each test counts for 30% of your grade. Both tests are open-book and based on the readings and lectures. The LearnSmart modules are through the textbook publisher, McGraw-Hill, and are primarily to make sure that you are reading the chapters. You will be given a due date to complete modules. Those dates will be posted on Blackboard, your McGraw-Hill Account, and I will also remind you (many times).

MAKE-UP TESTS

Due to this being an online class and due to the fact that I will give you plenty of notice ahead of time, there will not be any make-up tests. I will make both the mid-term and final exams available for a four to five-day period on Blackboard. You can take it at any time during that period. It will be timed so, when you start, you need to be able to finish it in one sitting. Because you have this option, any extracurricular activities and/or employment obligations that conflict will not entitle a student to a makeup test. If you have an issue with internet access during the time period, let me know as soon as possible.

THE COURTROOM VISIT

I require students in all my classes to watch courtroom proceedings. It can be at any courthouse. If you live in Tennessee (or any other state) and you want to do it there, that is perfectly fine. All I require as proof is the date of the courtroom visit, the courthouse location and a two-paged, double-spaced, 12-point font paper about what you heard, saw, experienced, etc. I do not need a novel, just explaining what you experienced clear enough for me to believe that you went. Be advised: do not use AI, ChatGPT, etc. to do this. I will catch you and you will risk getting turned in for academic dishonesty. Over the years, a lot of students have given positive feedback about this. All courtrooms (with some exceptions like Juvenile court) are open to the public. You don't need a reason to be there. The paper is due the last day of class (which I will make clear on Blackboard and remind you multiple times).

DAY ONE ACCESS
