Social psychology (PSY 350):

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Class structure: synchronous and asynchronous distance learning hybrid – we will meet on zoom every Wednesday from

10:20AM-11:15AM

Office hours: by appointment to better accommodate student

schedules. E-mail me and I will gladly arrange a time to meet with you.

Course catalog description:

A general introduction to social psychology for majors and non-majors in psychology. The psychology of how people think about and relate to others. Topics include love, altruism, aggression, conformity, behavior in groups, leadership, intergroup conflict, prejudice, and persuasion.

General class structure:

This class has five units. Each unit is about three weeks long. We will meet on zoom every Wednesday as well as optionally the Monday before each test. **All Wednesday zoom sessions are from 10:20AM-11:15AM.** On the first day of class, we will determine two (or more) different times review sessions will be held on the Monday before the test that all class members can attend. The exact schedule of when you need to be in class and what you need to do to prepare is at the bottom of this syllabus. Below is the general structure for each of the five units.

Your grade:

The tests make up 35% of your grade (7% each). The short papers make up 35% of your grade (also 7% each). The group in class activities make up 30% of your grade

(3% each). If you attend an optional review session for a unit, you will receive three points of extra credit on that unit's test.

Lectures:

Before each class, you will usually listen to one lecture. They are on PowerPoint and 30 minutes to an hour long each. Please note that they have audio. **It is essential to listen to the audio**, as that is where the vast majority of the test questions come from. There is not much text on the slides.

It is very important to take notes while you listen to the audio. This is for two reasons: the test is open note so you will be able to refer to these notes, and taking notes should result in you only needing to listen to the lecture one time to master the material.

In class group activities:

In the first two Wednesdays of the unit, we will meet on zoom for a group in class activity. These make up your in class activities grade for this class, and they are generally participation grades. Many activities will be small group, and then we will reconvene as a whole class to discuss. You will have the same small group throughout this class.

Short papers:

Each unit will have a short paper that should be two pages double spaced (about 500-750 words). The prompts are on Blackboard. The papers should draw from lecture content. They will encourage you to think more deeply about the topics we are learning about. They are due the Friday after each test.

Multiple choice tests:

Instead of having 2 or 3 major exams and multiple quizzes, this class has 5 tests. The tests cover less than a typical exam would since there are five of them. I hope this makes you feel less stressed as a student. There is no cumulative exam at the end of this course. Each test is only on the material covered in the current unit.

These tests occur about every three weeks on a Wednesday during class at 10:20AM. The tests are synchronous and timed. If you haven't fully absorbed the content, you will be exceptionally lucky if you find enough time to search for all of the answers. There are 25 questions that you must complete in 30 minutes. Please keep in mind that I have been doing timed tests with similar timing throughout my teaching career, and have found this time limit to be appropriate for this type of test. You cannot take extra time unless you have an ADA accommodation you have discussed with me at least a week in advance. To promote fairness, the average test grade for the class will never be lower than an 85. If the class average is less than 85, I will curve the test so the class average is moved up to 85.

Optional review packets:

Each test has an optional review packet. If you can't figure out an answer to a question on the optional review packet, or have confusion about any of the questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to me! I would be more than happy to help. On the optional review days, we can also talk about questions you may have.

Discussion board:

This class does not have a discussion board. I have received a lot of feedback that many students do not feel they get much out of discussion boards, so we will focus on other learning metrics.

Finals:

There are no finals or term papers in this class. Pedagogy research has informed my teaching philosophy of discrete units and papers as opposed to finals. It should help you better understand what you are learning from a critical and nuanced viewpoint. I hope it's less stressful, too.

Textbook:

You do not need to buy a textbook for this course. Everything you need for this class is free. My lectures draw from the 14th edition of *Social Psychology* by David Myers and Jean Twenge as well as from primary source literature we will discuss in class.

Blackboard:

The lectures, tests, and materials for this class are all on our course's BlackBoard site. More information on how to access and navigate BlackBoard can be found here: https://www.wku.edu/citl/services/tools/blackboard.php. If you are having any issues figuring out how to navigate BlackBoard, e-mail me and I will help you until it makes sense to you.

Make up work:

If you are sick or experiencing a major life event, you may be eligible to extend a deadline. However, you must discuss this need with me on the front end. To be fair to everyone, I do not allow make up work that was not discussed two days before the deadline except in cases of emergencies.
